The attached report covers the sighting of a UFO on the evenings 17, 18, 19 and 21 May 1964 in the area of central New Jersey; specifically, northeast of Camden, New Jersey. This report is in accordance with AFR 200-2 and follows the format in paragraph 14 of the regulation. There were four distinct sightings by: (1) Mr. [REDACTED] Avenue, Burlington, NJ, [REDACTED] and (2) Mr. [REDACTED] Street, Delanco, NJ.


