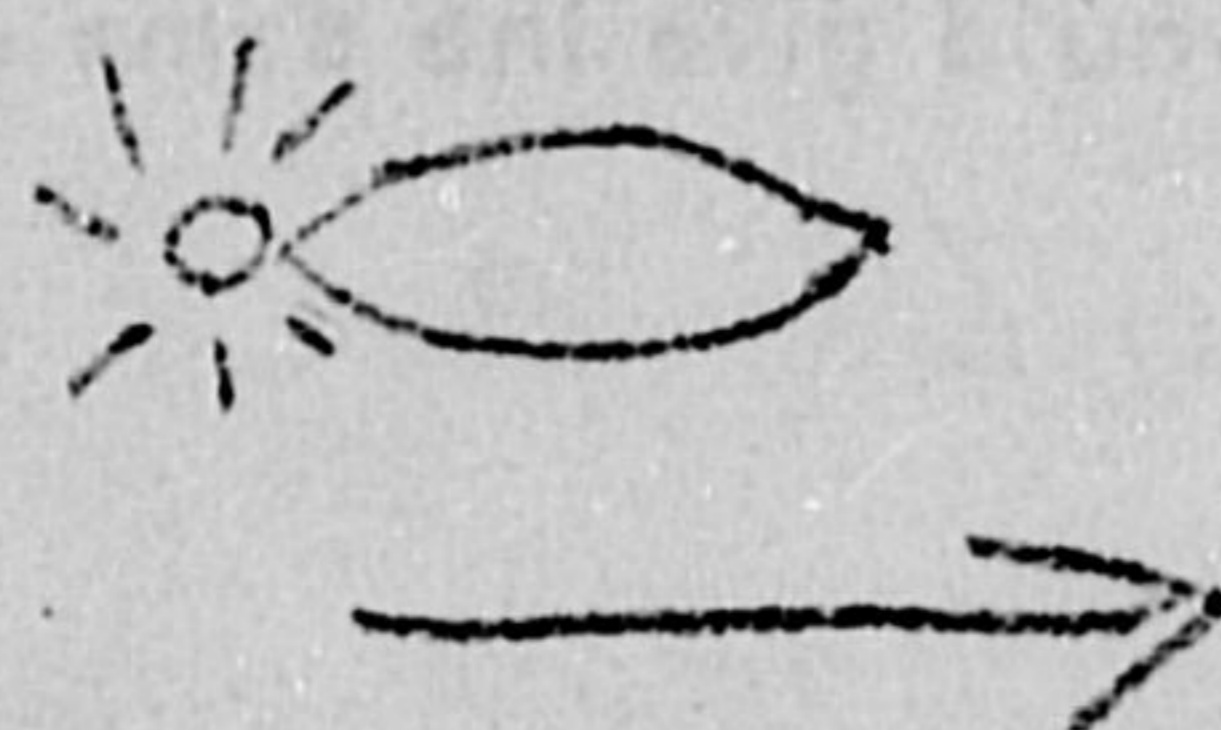

The President has asked that I reply to your recent letter regarding "flying saucers."

The investigation of unidentified flying objects reported in the skies over the United States is the responsibility of the Air Force. The name of this project is Blue Book.

In 18 years of investigating over 9000 reports of unidentified flying objects, the evidence has proved almost conclusively that reported aerial phenomena have been objects either created and sent aloft by man, generated by atmospheric conditions, or caused by celestial bodies of the residue of meteoric activity.

There has never been any evidence that UFOs reported to the Air Force represented extraterrestrial vehicles. No such object reported to the Air Force has given any indication of a threat to the United States nor has any evidence been presented that any unidentified flying object exhibited characteristics beyond the scope of current technical or scientific knowledge.

I am enclosing a copy of FTD Form 154 which is used for making reports of this nature to the Air Force. This form should be completed as fully as possible and returned to the following address so that an evaluation can be made of your sighting:



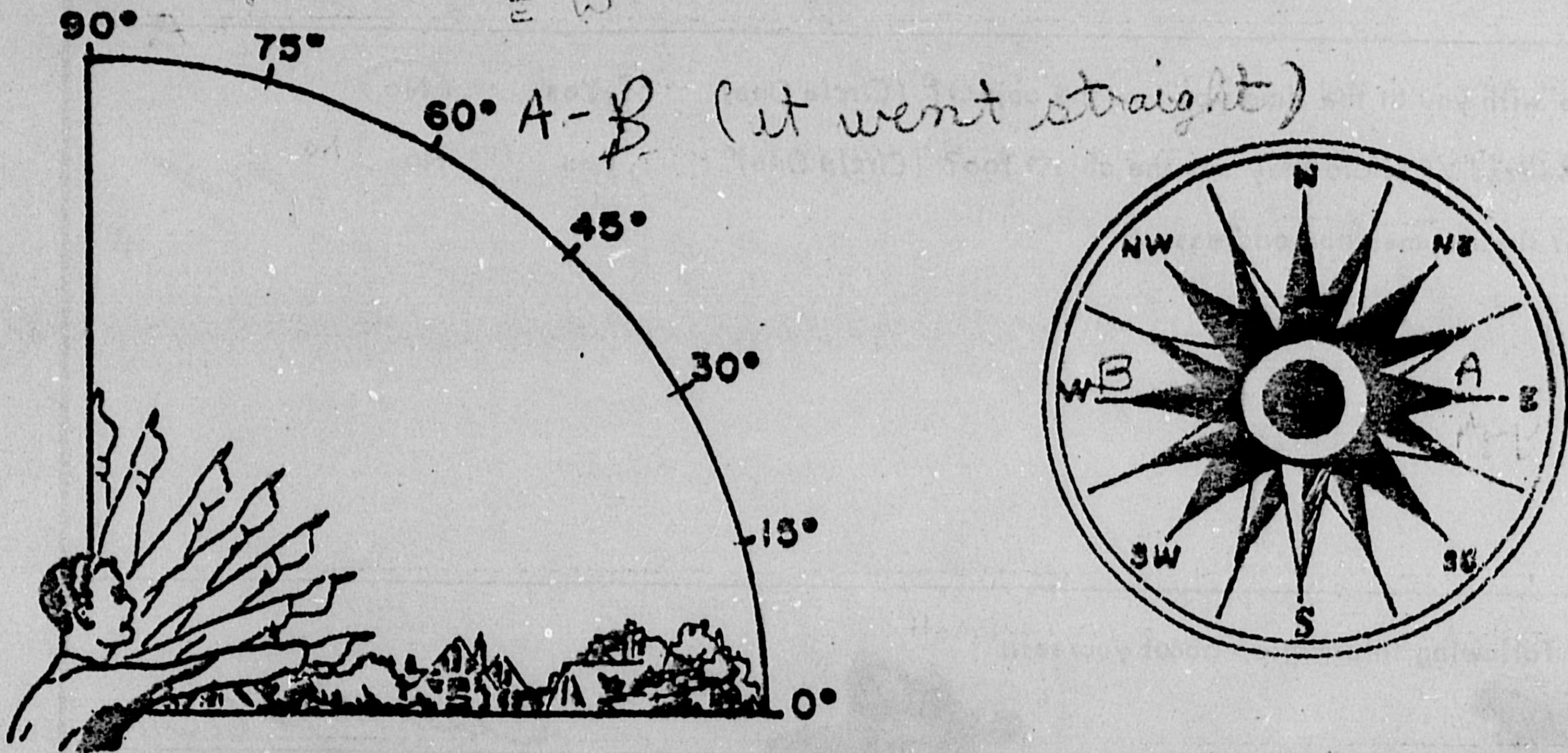

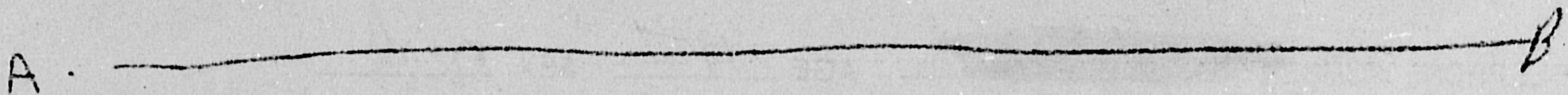

Dear Sirs,

Sunday night July 4, 1965 at approximately 9:30 P.M. my cousin and I saw an unidentified flying object in the sky. I was visiting my cousin [REDACTED] who lives in Arlington Mass. when this occurred. At the time we had been casually observing the eastern sky when [REDACTED] spotted the object. I was looking through the telescope when [REDACTED] called my attention to the moving object in the sky. Before we saw the object start to move it had been completely stationary, forming with two other stars an acute isosceles triangle. Then it sped up rapidly and it appeared to be traveling at approximately 50 thousand miles an hour. It appeared to be moving through the sky about three times faster than our own satellites such as Echo I. which I observed earlier. This object which was in the eastern sky, began moving



downward in a diagonal line towards the south. After moving for about two or three minutes it slowed down gradually and then came to a complete stop. It remained motionless for about twenty seconds. Then it began to travel again, making a 90 degree turn towards the north. It then disappeared over the eastern horizon. Throughout this event the object was bluish green except for a few seconds when it appeared to get lighter.

We called the office of the U.F.O. (Unidentified Flying Objects) and asked if there was an earth-made satellite visible at 9:30 on that evening. They said that only Echo I was visible, but at a different time - 10:30. They also said that this object could not have been an airplane if it was maneuvering the way we had described it and if it also came to a complete stop. Without a doubt this object had maneuvering abilities that were utterly fantastic.

TWO ANTARCTIC BASES SIGHT 'FLYING SAUCER'

SANTIAGO, Chile—From the Antarctic Thursday came official reports that a mysterious lens-shaped flying object, maneuvering and moving at great speed, was sighted last Saturday.

A Chilean base commander in the Antarctic reported that the object was "yellowish red, changing to green, yellow and orange."

In Buenos Aires, the navy issued a communique saying that personnel at Argentina's Antarctic base saw the flying object and photographed it.

Mario Jahn Barrera, commander of the Chilean base, told the defense ministry by radio that it would be too much to say that "all of us saw a flying saucer, one of these science-fiction things."

"However," he continued, "it was something real, an object

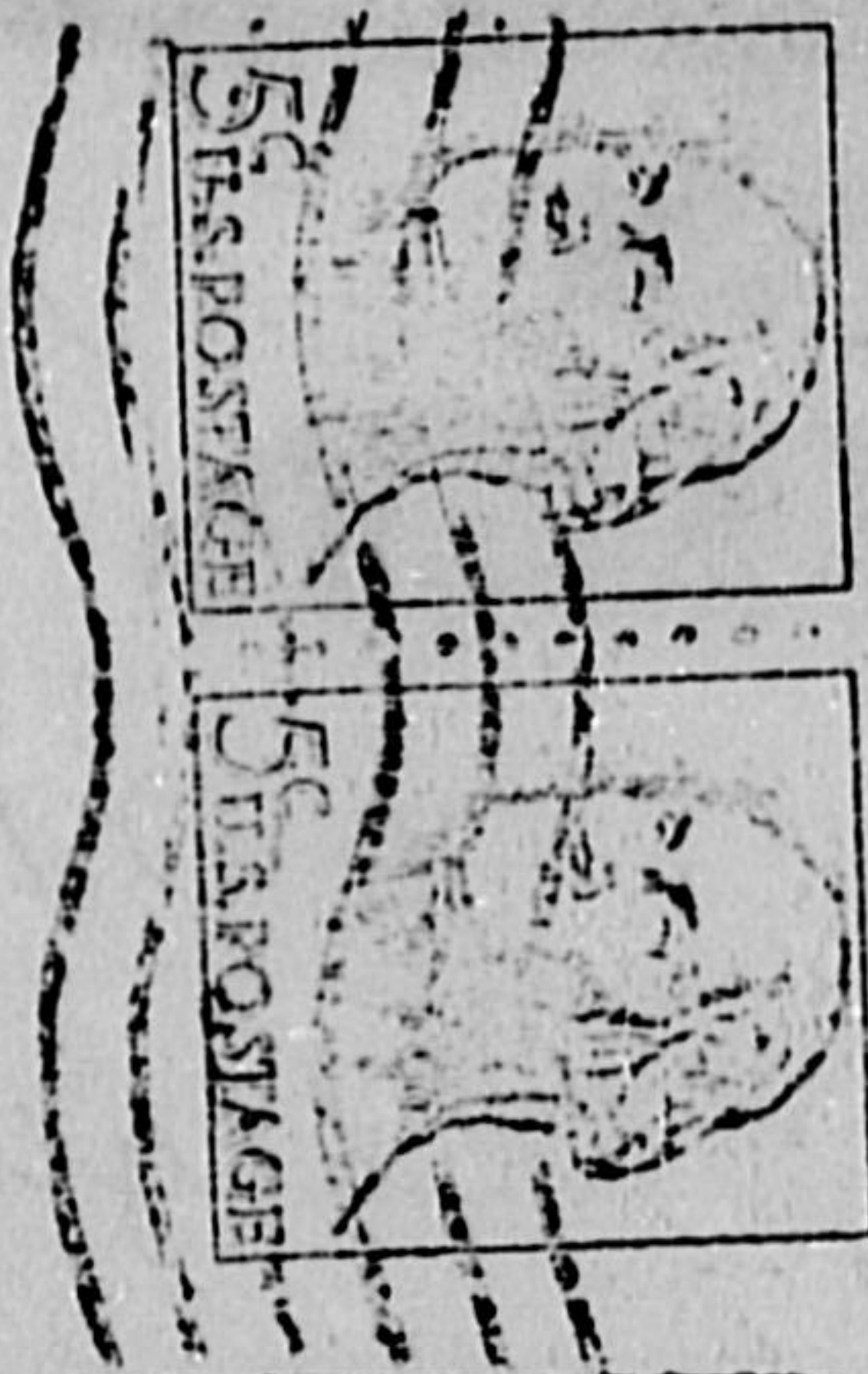
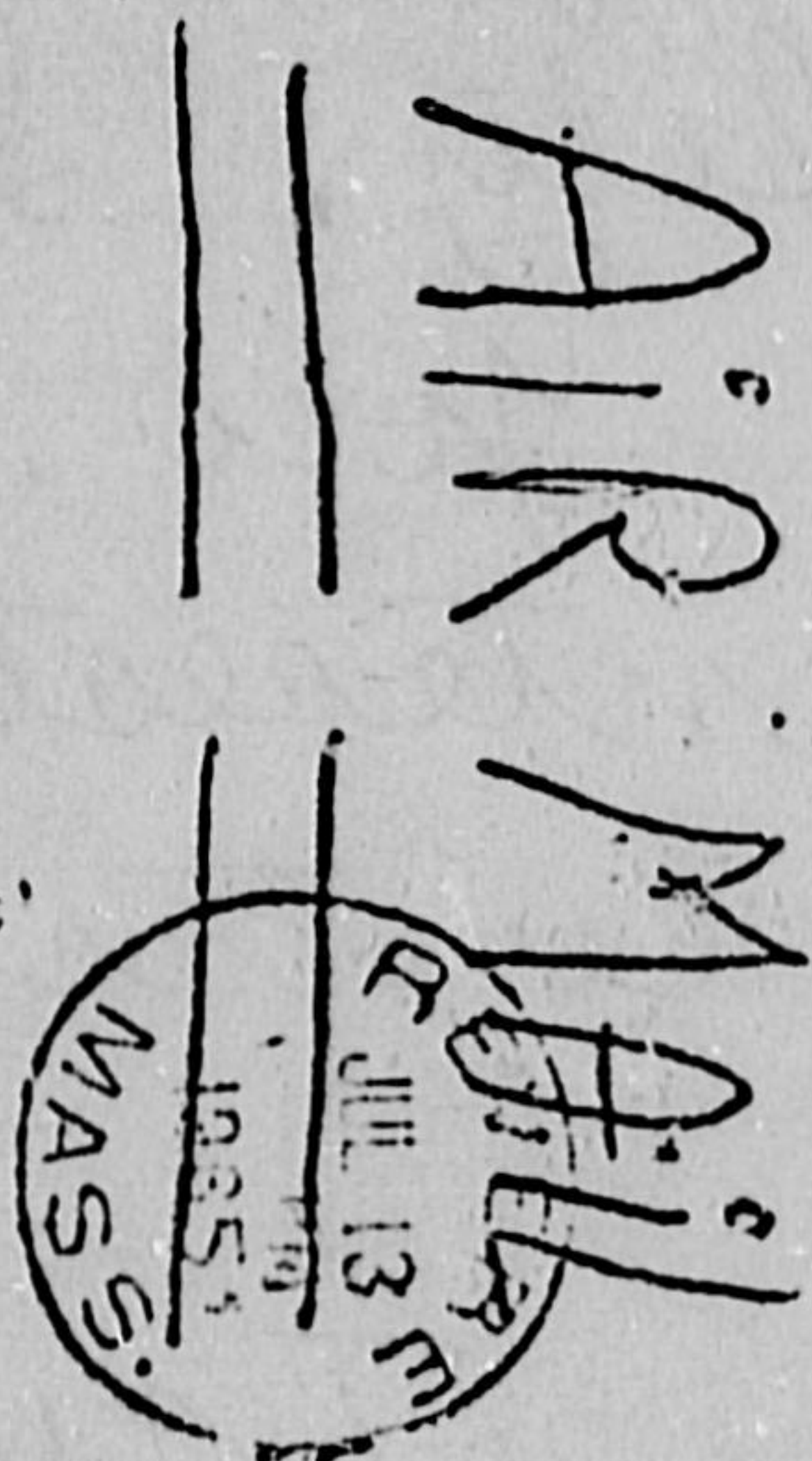
that moved at amazing speed maneuvered quickly and gave off a blue-green sheen. It also caused interference in the electromagnetic apparatus of an Argentine base which is facing ours on a nearby small island."

The interference was confirmed by the navy communique issued in Buenos Aires.

The object was yellowish red," Jahn said, "changing to green, yellow and orange. It would zigzag quickly. Then it stopped and we promptly reached for field glasses, telescopes, anything at hand to sight it. We watched as it remained quietly there for about 20 minutes."

Jahn said that a corporal took color pictures, but that there are no facilities for developing the film. The men must wait for eight months to be relieved to have the film developed on the mainland.

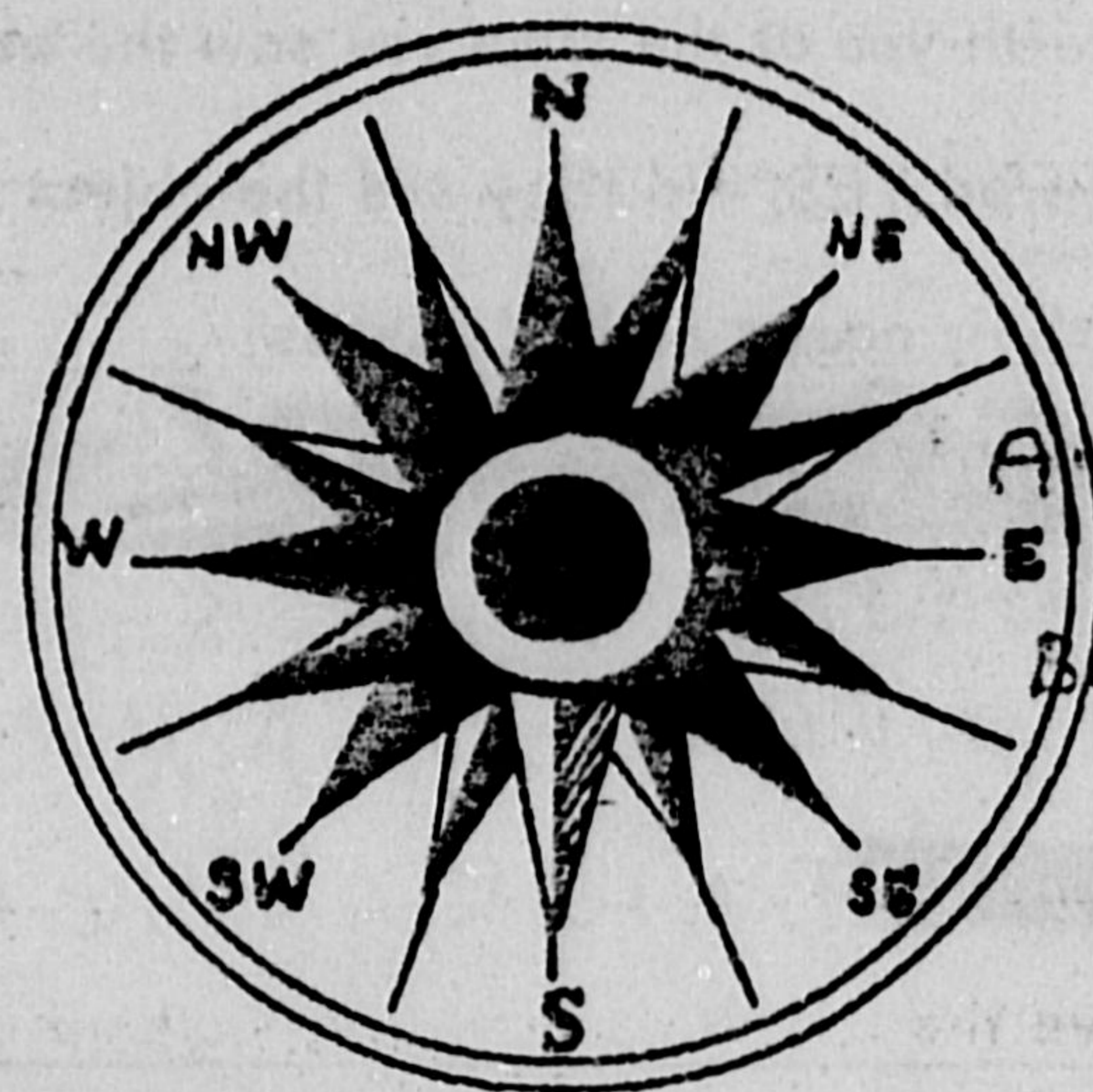
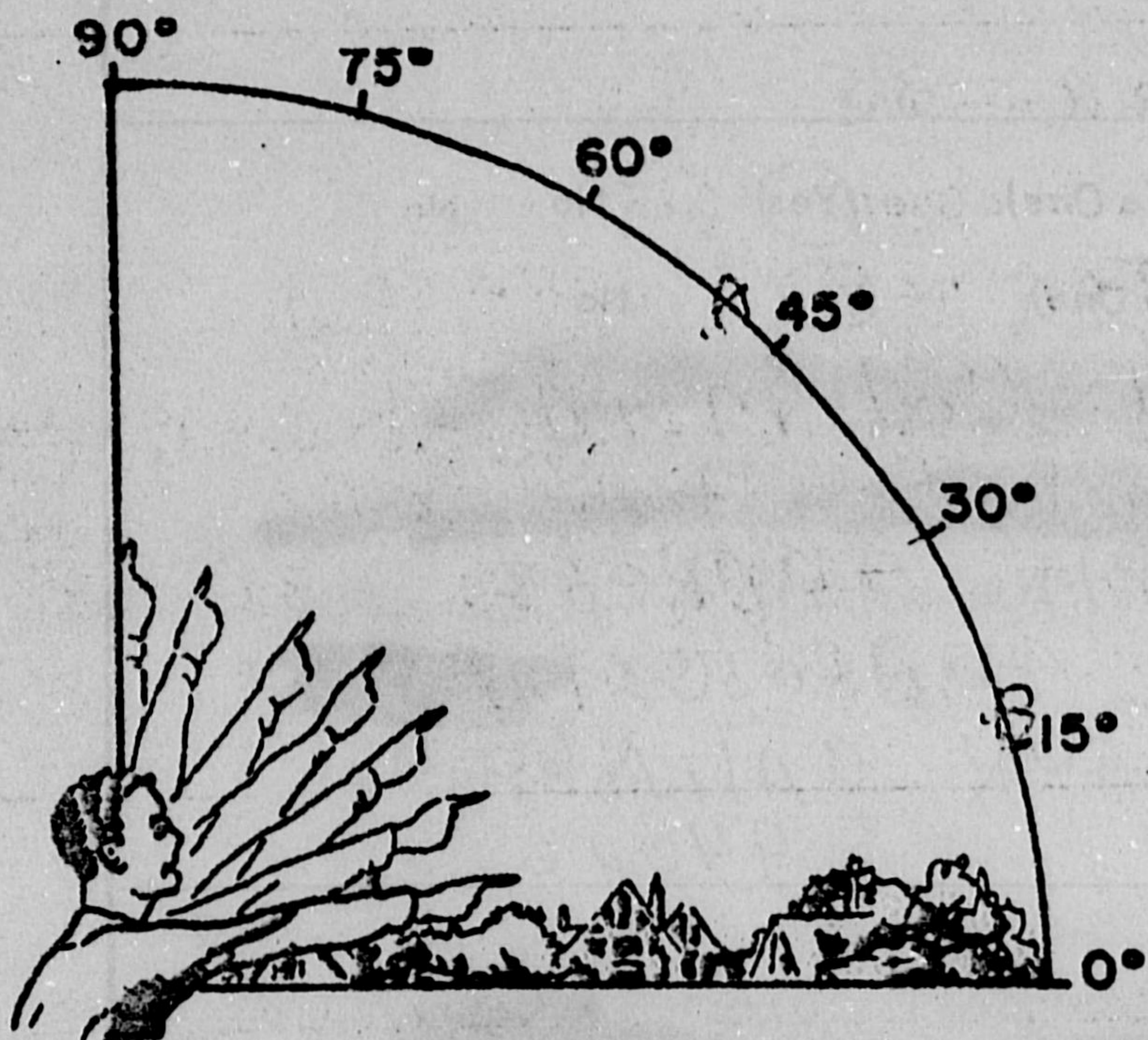
