I have made out a report on an unidentified flying object that I saw almost a year ago. It is my hope that I have included sufficient information and data on the UFO, to be helpful in your investigations. Though it is almost a year now, I can recall the incident because of a few notes and because it was the most unusual aerial object I have ever seen.

1) When did you see the object?

4) Where were you when you saw the object?

I first saw the object through the north upstairs window of our house, watching it for approximately five seconds, I ran downstairs, got my telescope, and observed the object from our front yard.

5) Estimate how long you saw the object. 1 minute - Certain

6) What was the condition of the sky? Bright Twilight

7) If you saw the object during daylight, twilight, or dawn where was the sun as you looked at the object? - To my left

8) If you saw the object at night, twilight, or dawn, what did you notice concerning the stars and the moon?

Only the moon was visible in the eastern sky. (It was about 2:00 P.M.)

9.) Was the object brighter than the background of the sky?

The object itself wasn't brighter than the background of the sky.

10) Did the object:

a) Appear to stand still at any time? - No

b) Suddenly speed up or rush away? - No

c) Break up or explode? - No

d) Dive off course? - No

e) Change brightness? - Yes

f) Change shape? - No

g) Pulsate, flicker, or vibrate? - No

11) Did the object move behind something at anytime? - Yes
It moved behind some trees.

14) Tell in a few words about the object.

Sound: No sound was heard.

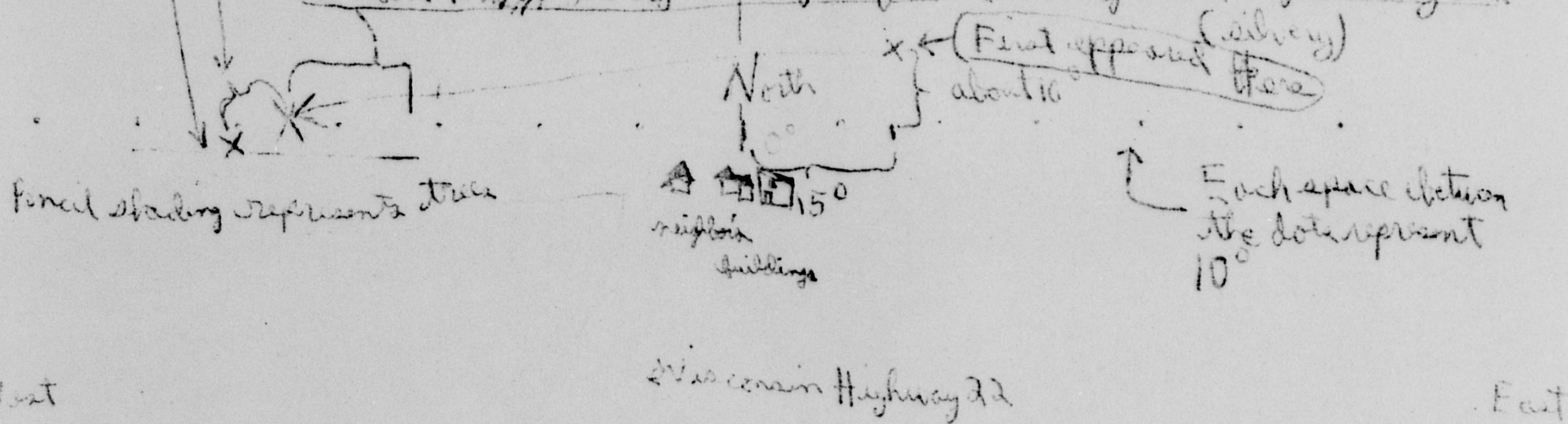
Color: The saucer was dark in color, except for the two orange lights, one on each side, on the bottom of the object.

15) Draw a picture, label and sketch in details

The line in the background represents the horizon.

For about this distance the new silvery object could be seen behind the trees.

For about 10 ~~seconds~~ the object changed from a dark object to a bright shiny one.



This view is based on a reference point in my front yard, the tree to be exact.

16) The edges of the object were: fuzzy or blurred, but they appeared solid.

17.) Draw a picture that will show the motion the object made.
Question 15 shows the path that the object took.

18.) If possible, estimate size in feet.

This can't be accomplished because the distance and altitude are unknown.

19.) How large did the object appear as compared with an object held at arm's length.

The object could not be seen with the naked eye, it could only be observed through a telescope. Very bright flashes of silver light which occurred alternately and sometimes consecutively were the only signs of the unidentified flying object to the naked eye. The object didn't seem to change attitude when these flashes occurred.

20.) How did the object disappear from view?

The object passed behind some trees and then went over the horizon.

21.) Describe its construction.

It was a dark rather hazy solid looking object with two orange lights on the bottom, one on each side. It was definitely elliptical, a "saucer" shaped object, that if one would take two regular saucers and put them together, one would then have a similar looking object. The object was hazy though, but it looked solid and one of the orange lights on the bottom blocked out part of the object.*

22.) Where were you when you saw the object?

The only place I saw the object itself was in our front yard and only by means of a telescope.

* Both of these lights "blacked out" a portion of the object.

23.) Were you in the open country? Yes

24.) What were you doing at the time you saw the object?
Just previous to seeing the object I was doing school work. I happened to notice the object when my mother said an airplane had just "flashed" in the northern sky and I went to our upstairs window to take a look. I could see no aircraft, but suddenly there was a bright metallic flash (swoosh) and I thought to myself an aircraft would have to be making an extraordinary maneuver, possibly even disintegrating. At this time, I ran downstairs and out into our front yard to observe through my telescope.

25.) What direction were you looking when you first saw the object? I was looking approximately N by E.

26.) What direction were you looking when you last saw the object? I was looking approximately northwest.

27.) When it first appeared:

a) From True North 15 degrees (East)
b) From horizon about 10 degrees

When it disappeared:

a) From True North about 45 degrees (West)
b) From horizon 0 degrees

28.) What were the weather conditions when you saw the object?
Clouds: a few clouds
Wind: no wind
Weather: dry
Temperature: cool

29.) Was anyone else with you at the time you saw the object? Yes, my mother saw only the flashes but didn't see the object directly.

30.) Was this the first time you had seen an object like this?

Yes it was, but in May of 1964, I saw three unidentified flying objects dissimilar to the one in February of that year.

31.) In your opinion what do you think caused or could have caused it?

In my opinion, I would classify this object as an unidentified flying object; its cause unknown.

32.) Can you estimate the speed or distance.

The distance is unknown; therefore so is the speed, size and altitude.

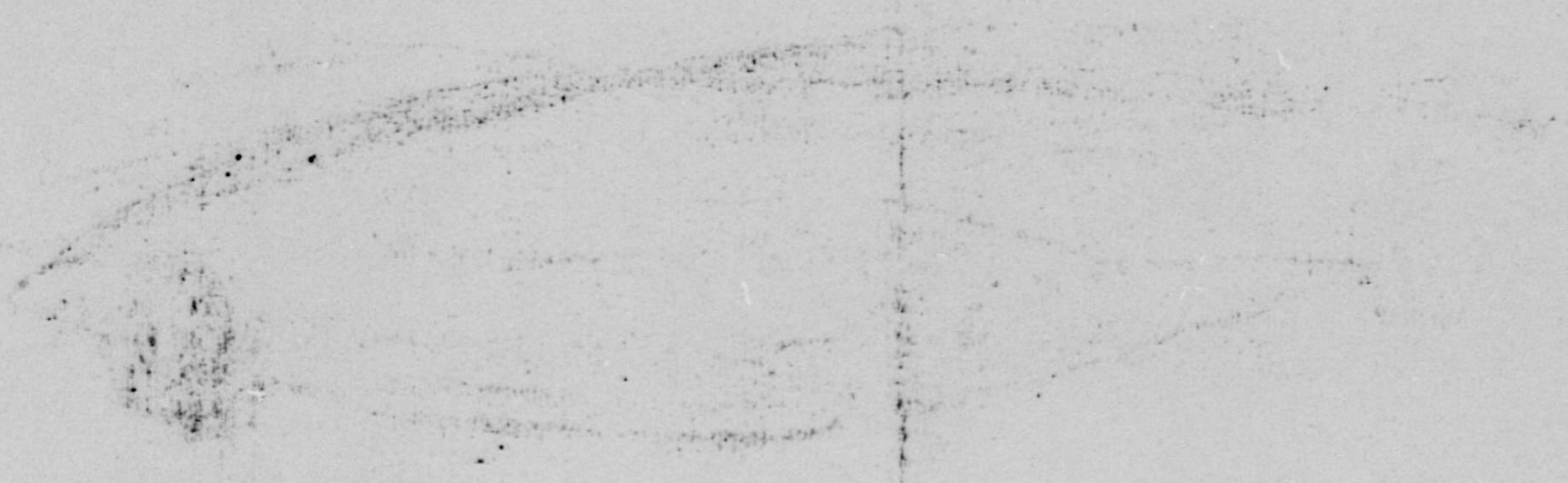

The pencil doesn't represent the color, but is there
to show something solid. The object's color didn't
vary in consistency, it was just dark.

(I drew this last February after I saw the UFO)

Summary Sheet

On February 21, 1964, from 5:16:30 P.M. to 5:17:30 P.M.*
I observed an unidentified flying object, dark in color,
elliptical and solid looking in form with 2 orange lights
one on each side on the bottom. * (Central Standard Time)

The object itself was not visible to the naked eye,
but I found it quickly by looking between the flashes
of brilliant silver light ^{with my telescope.} These flashes didn't occur more
every second, or so, consecutively, but something on this
order: flash flash, pause, flash, pause, flash flash, pause, flash,
pause, flash, pause, flash, pause, flash flash. I didn't keep
track of these flashes because I was too absorbed in
observing the object. The time of the pauses also varied.

I checked my telescope to see if it was in focus and
it was. I checked the object for wings, horizontal and
vertical stabilizers, nacelles, and any protruding surface
and found none. The object seemed to be surrounded by
a layer of shimmering air, which might indicate heat.

(A note about the flashes; the object apparently didn't
change attitude during these flashes as could be observed
while watching the object while the flashes took place.)
The object remained in a horizontal attitude and appeared
not to have any changes in the axis of pitch, roll or
yaw. No contrails or exhaust gases were noted & produced
no sound.

As the object neared the trees and the horizon, it turned a
bright silver color for about ten seconds before it was lost
from sight.

The object seemed to be pursuing a WNW course at about a
degree a second at between 5 and 10 degrees above the horizon.
Just as it turned silver, it appeared to pursue a more

northwesterly course. It seemed to "skate", that is, it moved north then south and then pursued the northwesterly course. It did this once, as I say again, just as it turned silver.

Since the distance to the object is unknown, its size and altitude can't be calculated.

This object didn't resemble any known aircraft. As I said before, it had no wings, tail assembly, nacelle, or any visible engine, prop or jet.

It (the object itself) appeared to follow its course at a perfectly uniform speed. At no time did the object pulsate or throb.

It also seemed solid. I could not see through it. Those pale orange lights on the bottom blocked out portions of the object.

I saw it for about a total of 1 minute. I observed it from about 5:16:30 P.M. C.S.T. to 5:17:30 C.S.T. When I first saw it, it was about fifteen (15) degrees east of North (as close as I can approximate) and between 5 and 10 degrees above the horizon. It disappeared 45° west of north over the horizon. It could be seen through the trees. The object could be seen only through a telescope or binoculars since it wasn't visible to the naked eye.

My hobby for the past ~~10~~ seven years has been airplanes and I am thoroughly familiar with most aircraft.
