The following report was submitted by **[Redacted]** on 28 July 1952. Apparent authenticity of information submitted and reliability of source is B-3. The report is as follows:

No brief description of object sighting as to its size, shape, color and aerodynamic features are available. Time of object sighting was 2005 MST 28 July 1952. Length of observation was approximately four minutes. Manner of observation was visual, no optical or electrical equipment was used in sighting.

Object was in a southeasterly direction approaching municipal airport area of Phoenix, Arizona. Flight pattern of object was irregular to the extent that it changed directions 90° from right to left and occasionally hovering.

As object placed itself over Sky Harbor Airport it became stationary at approximately 10,000 feet for one minute and then ascended into cloud coverage at 20,000 feet. Source stated that the object moved straight up from 10,000 feet to 20,000 feet in two minutes.

Source indicated that he was familiar with the flight characteristics of the present day aircraft and unfamiliar with object sighted.

No meteorological phenomenon accounted for the sighting. No physical evidence, photo, etc. available. Interception or identification action taken-none.
