ATTN INT 1-21-2, YOUR MSG DTD 21 JUNE 59, REPORTING AN UFO SIGHTING. WHAT WAS THE ELEVATION AND AZIMUTH, IN DEGREES, OF OBJECT WHEN FIRST OBSERVED? WHAT WAS THE DISTANCE BETWEEN OBSERVERS AND OBJECT? HOW WAS IT DETERMINED THAT OBJECT WAS GOING STRAIGHT UP? WERE ALL WITNESSES LOCATED 6 MI SE OF ALEXANDRIA, LA? THE TWO A/C REPORTED TO HAVE DEPARTED ENGLAND WOULD HAVE MADE REPORTED GLOW, BUT NOT FOR 5 MINUTES, AND NOT IN THE WEST WHEN HEADING EAST. THERE IS ALSO 23 MINUTES DIFFERENCE IN TIME OF SIGHTING AND TIME OF A/C DEPARTURE. REQUEST A FURTHER INTERROGATION OF WITNESSES, AND CHECK WITH OTHER UNITS FOR THE POSSIBLE PRESENCE OF BALLOONS, A/C, ETC, THAT MIGHT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THIS SIGHTING.

UNCLAS FROM OP 1-30-2 ATTN: AFCIN SUBJECT: UFO REPORTS. THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION IS SUBMITTED IN ANSWER TO YOUR MESSAGE 4E4G 6-1329-E.

WITNESSES WERE REINTEROGATED, MR. [REDACTED] IS STATED THAT OBJECT WAS NORTHWEST OF HIS POSITION AS STATED IN THE ORIGINAL MESSAGE. OBJECT APPEARED LOW IN THE SKY APPROXIMATELY TEN DEGREES. WITNESSES STATED OBJECT WAS FIVE MILES OR LESS AWAY ALSO STATED THAT IT WAS HIS AND THE OPINION OF THE FOUR OTHER THAT THE OBJECT WAS GONG STRAIGHT UP. ALL OF THE WITNESSES WZRE LOCATED IN THE SAME PLACE AS STATED IN THE ORGIINAL MESSAGE. AFTER A CHECK OF OTHER AGENCIES THERE WAS NO REPORTS OF BALLONS OR OTHER OBJECTS BEING

PRESENT AT THE TIME IN THE AREA. THE TWENTY THREE MINUTES DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE TIME OF THE SIGHTING AND THE TAKE OFF TIME OF THE TWO JETS COULD BE REDUCED BY INACCURACY OF THE REPORTING TIME.
