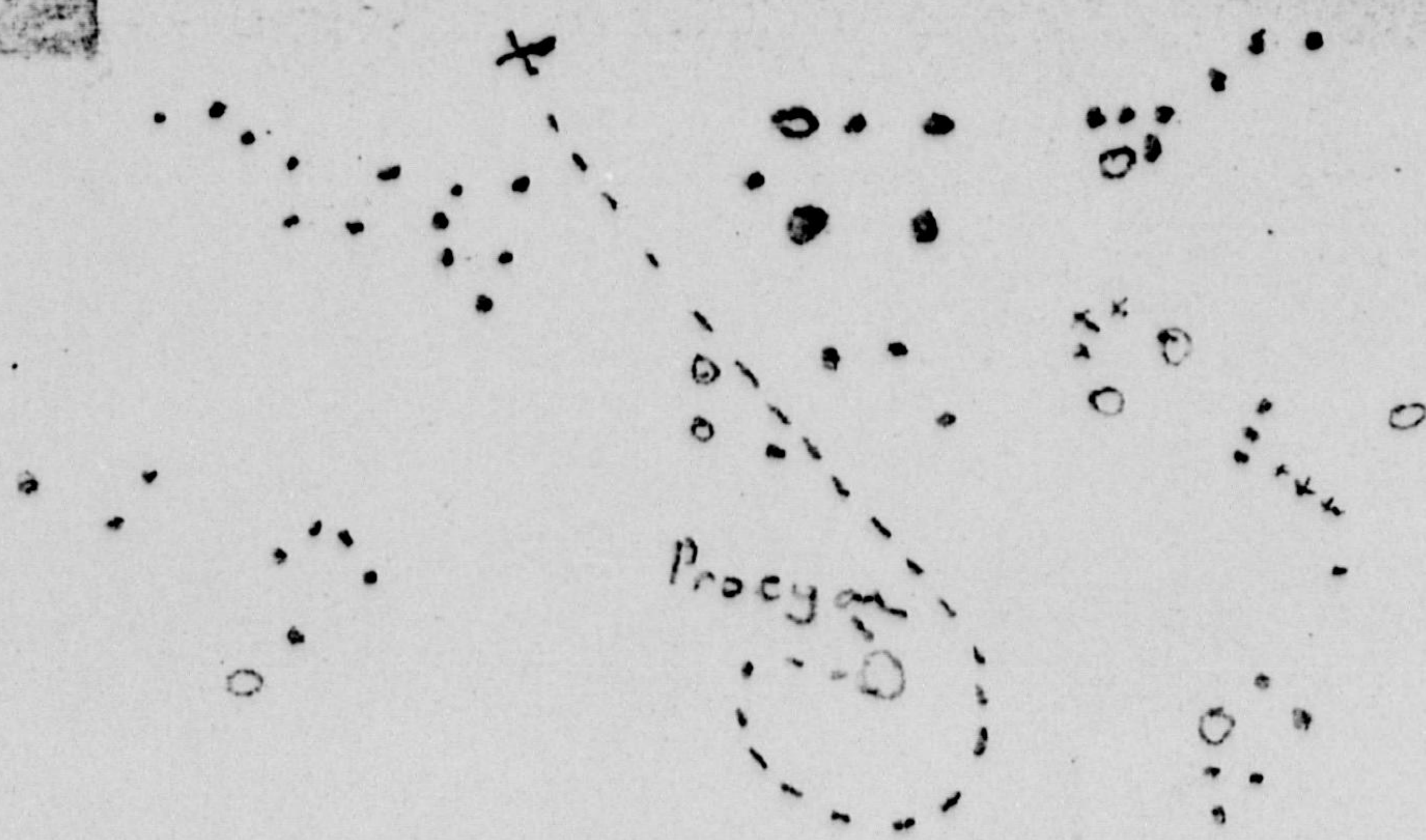

On 24 Oct 1963 [REDACTED] and his sister observed an unidentified object by Cupar Fife, Scotland. The sighting is carried as an unidentified and was used to illustrate a report of this nature in the brochure which your office has released to the general public. We suggest that you notify [REDACTED] that we were unable to identify the object which he sighted and express our appreciation for his report. Also, inform him that we have taken the liberty of including the observation as part of the attached information sheet and that his sighting was used not only as a sample of an unidentified report but was also included because of the excellent presentation. While several essential factors, such as the duration and manner of disappearance, were omitted such statements as "We thought at first it was an aeroplane" gives an indication of the speed and appearance that the object presented to him.
