(4) INDIVIDUAL INITIALLY SAW ONE OBJECT; THEN IT DIVIDED INTO TWO OBJECTS ABOUT 1/2 INCH APART IN A POSITION NORTHWEST. SIZE: 1/4 INCH EACH OBJECT.

(5) THEY APPEARED TO BE IN FORMATION AFTER THEY SPLIT.

(6) ROUND

(7) NO TRAIL; E.E., SMOKE OR CONTRAIL.

(8) ROLLING THUNDER; LOCOMOTIVE IN THE FAR DISTANCE.

THE NOISE HAD A SLOW FREQUENCY TO IT.

(9) NONE, JUST A ROUND LIGHT.

(1) SOUND OR NOISE OF THE OBJECT(S).

(2) HE FIRST SAW OBJECT(S) TO THE SOUTHEAST TRAVELING THROUGH NORTHWEST AT AN ANGLE OF 40 DEGREES FROM THE HORIZONTAL. APPROXIMATE ALTITUDE 6000 FEET.

(3) OBJECTS WERE 45 DEGREES FROM THE HORIZONTAL AND IN A NORTHWEST POSITION, CLIMBING VERY RAPIDLY. HE SAW AN AIRCRAFT APPROXIMATELY 5 MILES NORTHEAST AFTER OBJECTS
